☀ **May 7 – September 9** ☀ **Hours of Operation:**
(Schedule varies) 10:00 AM – 8:00 PM* ☀

Exit water at 7:50 PM sharp.

***Being in the pool area after closing constitutes trespassing and the police have been notified to arrest violators.**

*If you are over 18 and have returned the unguarded hours waiver, you may be in the pool between 6:30 AM and 8 PM if you follow the additional rules stated on the waiver.

There will be a \$15 charge for additional or replacement fobs. 3 fobs per household maximum.

IF THERE IS AN EMERGENCY AT THE POOL, DIAL 911 FROM THE POOL PHONE IMMEDIATELY!

By order of **Wake County Health Department** all members and guests **must** adhere to the pool rules. If a violation is cited, it may cause the pool to close for an extended period of time and may result in fines or suspension of privileges.

1. **NO GLASS CONTAINERS ALLOWED IN THE POOL OR DECK AREA!** Broken glass in the pool may cause the pool to close for as long as a week. The homeowner responsible may incur costs (generally \$1,000+) associated with the draining and re-filling of the pool (if re-filling is legally allowed by county and state officials).
2. **THE DOOR & GATES TO THE POOL AREA MUST REMAIN CLOSED AT ALL TIMES.** Do not prop the door open in any way! This violates a health regulation in Wake County and poses a very real danger to our young residents (and causes the alarm to sound). Do not allow in someone who does not have a fob. Your fob access will be turned off if you do not pay your HOA assessments (“dues”). **SWIMMING ALONE IS NOT PERMITTED.**
3. **PETS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE PREMISES.**
4. Training pants with snug-fitting rubber pants or the newly-designed swim diapers are required for any infant/child not toilet trained. “Swim diapers” are not sufficient. ***Fecal contamination will cause the pool to close for 24 hours while water treatment is conducted. The association reserves the right to charge owners responsible for the cost of water and cleanup.***

The following **RULES AND REGULATIONS** are for the protection of the community and to help ensure that every family enjoys the pool season. Not all behaviors that should be avoided at a pool can be written here.

1. Respect other residents and their guests. If something dangerous or disturbing is occurring, please use common sense. Not all behaviors that should be avoided at a pool can be written here. **Board members, community management and pool management company staff have the right to ask anyone to leave the pool at any time in their sole discretion.**
2. All residents must show proof of age/ name/ address with a valid state or federal photo ID. A picture or copy of your ID on your phone or on paper will be allowed. **Children under 16 must be accompanied by an authorized person 18 years or older.** During unguarded hours, those under 18 may not be in the pool area without a parent present, and that parent must have a signed unguarded hours access waiver on file with the HOA. All adult household members must be registered using the HOA form.

3. Guests must be accompanied by a homeowner. The homeowner is responsible for the conduct of their guests. **You must limit the number of guests to 4 per visit (including all guests, even children and those who will not be swimming) during guarded hours. NO GUESTS DURING UNGUARDED HOURS!** We must manage over-crowding. If you see people inside the pool area that are not residents of Churchill and are not accompanied by a resident, please call Knightdale police. **THIS MEANS POOL PARTIES ARE NOT PERMITTED AT CHURCHILL!**
4. Proper swimming attire is required in the pool. Please remember this is a family environment. Due to likelihood of severe damage to the pump, **no cut-offs or street clothes are allowed to be worn in the pool.**
5. RULES OF CONDUCT FOR POOL AND POOL AREA:
 - A. ABIDE BY ALL LIFEGUARD/ ATTENDANT INSTRUCTIONS LISTED OR UNLISTED ON THESE RULES!
 - B. ABSOLUTELY NO DIVING!
 - C. All users must be in the PPM system (tenants: tell owners to contact PPM if you're not listed)
 - D. No running, horseplay, pushing, shoving, etc. allowed.
 - E. No profanity or abusive language.
 - F. Pool furniture may not be moved (Umbrellas, tables, chairs included in this rule).
 - G. No loud music.
 - H. No skateboards, bicycles or rollerblades in the pool area.
 - I. No floats allowed in the pool – although baby floaties are OK.
 - J. No chewing gum in the pool or on the deck area.
 - K. No throwing objects anywhere inside the pool fence or pool.
6. Please properly dispose of all trash and leave the pool area clean. In case of spills on the tables or pool deck, please wash down area to keep insects and stains at a minimum.
7. Umbrellas must be closed before you leave the area. Strong gusts of wind may cause damage to the umbrellas.
8. The final ten minutes of every hour (including before closing) will be designated as adult or adults with infants swim. Persons under the age of 18 must exit the pool at this time. No sitting on the sides.
9. Intoxicated persons will be asked to leave by the pool manager or the police.
10. **NO SMOKING** (Including cigarettes, cigars, pipes, e-cigarettes, vaps, etc.).
11. Any personal items left at the pool will be put in the LOST & FOUND. Items left in the lost and found for more than 10 days will be donated.
12. The bathrooms must be left in good condition after use. Young children should be supervised by parents.
13. Patrons must vacate pool and deck at first sound of thunder **or** first sight of lightning. 30 minutes must pass after the last lightning and thunder strike before patrons may re-enter pool area.
14. Residents will sometimes need to leave the pool so the staff may make time for vacuuming/ maintenance, especially during early morning lap swim.

Slide Rules

1. Improper use of the slide shall result in pool management advising the parent/guardian of the revocation of child's use of the slide.
2. Members must be seated laying on their back, feet first. One person on the slide at a time.
3. Parents are responsible for supervising children on the slide. Take special care for children under 48" tall.
4. No flotation devices are allowed on the slide.
5. Form a line on the pool deck, not on the slide stairway.
6. Keep your arms and legs inside of the flume and exit the splashdown area immediately after going down the slide.

FAILURE TO FOLLOW ALL POOL RULES MAY RESULT IN REVOCATION OF POOL PRIVILEGES FOR ENTIRE FAMILY AND/ OR OTHER REPERCUSSIONS, INCLUDING FINES.
